NOTES:

NCAA Division I women's hockey continues to develop an unprecedented amount of talent, parity, and success on and off the ice. Consider:

- Women's hockey is expanding with 10 new DI teams in the last 10 years including the University of Delaware's inaugural season
- Just over 90% of skaters in the PWHL's second season were NCAA alumnae
 - Two-time Walter Cup Champions, the Minnesota Frost, were composed entirely of NCAA alums
- 94% of the 2025 PWHL draft were NCAA players including all players taken in the first round
- 97% of NCAA Division I women's hockey players earn a degree, and women's hockey ranks among the top graduation rates for college sports

2025 PWHL Draft Status:

In all, 45 of the 48 players selected during the six-round draft came from NCAA Division I hockey, including all eight first-round picks.

Twenty-two different schools had at least one former player drafted, led by Ohio State (six) and Minnesota Duluth (five). Minnesota, Penn State, Quinnipiac and Wisconsin each had four alumnae selected, while Clarkson and St. Cloud State had three each.
